Provisional Program and Agenda of the Workshop on Gender Equality in Higher Education in Kosovo Prishtina, October 11th, from 9:00 – 16:00, at Hotel International Prishtina

Background: As part of HERAS+ activities to promote a Human Rights-Based Approach in Higher Education, an analysis was conducted to identify good practices from an HRBA perspective at HEIs in Kosovo: the "Integration of a human rights-based approach in public higher education institutions in Kosovo," aiming to provide an overview of the inclusion of human rights in study programs (teaching and learning practices), research activities and their protection and the promotion by university mechanisms. The report was presented during HERAS+'s first HRBA workshop in September 2021. Inputs from participants during discussions at the workshop suggested a thorough and practically relevant gender analysis of higher education with a view on learning-teaching, research, and international cooperation as a follow-up.

Aim of the Event: The aim of the event is the dissemination and discussion of the final report of the Gender Equality Analysis in Higher Education with a view on the incorporation of gender dimensions in learning, teaching, research, professional development, and international cooperation. The report presents three dimensions of the analytical framework and points towards several issues that higher education institutions face when it comes to gender aspects: (i) gender & policy and management, (ii) gender & academic staff practice, and (iii) gender & study programs design and delivery. The Gender Analysis takes an action-oriented approach to provide practical guidance and recommendations for local higher education institutions and other stakeholders as relevant. This also includes recommendations and guidance regarding the implementation of principles of the "Horizon Europe Guidance on Gender Equality Plans" in the Kosovo context.

In addition, the workshop aims at presenting and discussing good practices of integrating gender dimensions in higher education in Kosovo within HERAS+ and beyond. It also provides insights and examples on how gender dimensions have been incorporated and embedded in teaching, research and at the institutional levels at universities in Austria.

Target group: Higher Education Institutions (academic and management staff), students, NGOs and other relevant stakeholders in the field of gender equality. Namely: The public Higher Education Institutions, The Gender Equality Agency (Prime Minister's Office), Kosovo Women Network (KWN), Ministry of Education, Science, Technology and Innovation: Division for International Cooperation in Higher Education, Department of Higher Education, and other relevant stakeholders.
