

CONTRACT

This Contract within the framework of the project Higher Education Research and Applied Science Plus – HERAS+ with the project number 8116-002020 which is financed by the Austrian Development Agency and and co-financed by the Ministry of Education and Science (MES), shall govern the relations and is concluded between the Contractual Parties:

World University Service – Austrian Committee (short: WUS Austria),

an Association by civil law, headquartered in Austria, 8010 Graz Schmiedgasse 403, registered on 27.10.1983, ZVR number 961843202, at competent authority Federal Police Headquarters, Graz, legally represented by Mag. Almir Kovacevic, Executive Director, and Veronika Nitsche, MBA, the Head of Finance,

on the one side, further referred to as *Contracting Body*,

and

Public University "Kadri Zeka"

on the other side, further referred to as *Recipient*.

The *Contracting Body* and the *Recipient* are further also referred to collectively as *Contractual Parties* and individually as *Contractual Party*.

Article 1. Subject of Contract

1.1 This contract rules the equipment purchase by the Recipient awarded by the *Contracting Body* within the Earmarked Funds Output 2 (Act. 2.2) granted by the HERAS+ project 8116-002020.

1.2. The Contractual Parties agree about the professional execution of work and obligations by this Contract.

1.3. The Contractual Parties shall cooperate in good faith to achieve the purposes set forth in this Contract.

1.4. Each Contractual Party shall immediately inform the other Contractual Party of any matters which may affect the performance of the Contract including delays in the performance.

1.5. The Recipient takes notice that the Project is supported by the Austrian Development Agency GmbH and will act in compliance with the donor's rules and regulations regarding the **tender procedures for the equipment purchase (Article 2.)**, the Guidelines (Annex I) for Equipment Requests of the HERAS+ consortium and the visibility rules (Annex II).
